Questions and Answers

What is Northern Health Plan (NHP), Plan B?

- A community sponsored program that helps uninsured people get health care services
- Uninsured residents of Alpena, Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet, Montmorency, Otsego, or Presque Isle County with low-income who cannot get Medicare or other programs are eligible for NHP, Plan B
- Services must be provided by a NHP member's assigned doctor
- If funds run short, some care will be limited.

Is NHP insurance?

- It is NOT insurance.

What services are covered by NHP, Plan B? (Summary ONLY – not a complete list)

Coverage	Co-pay
Office visits	\$5
Specialist services	\$5
Outpatient lab tests	\$0
Outpatient X-rays	\$0
Prescription medications (on approved list)	50% coinsurance
Walk-in/Urgent care	\$5

How does the program work?

- Members receive a white card from NHP
- Must get all care at the doctor's office they are assigned to
- Other care must be ordered by the NHP doctor at the office
- Prescriptions must be written for medications from the NHP approved list
- If a member goes to a non-participating doctor they may get a bill
- Some services may need prior authorization.

What is NOT covered?

(Summary ONLY – not a complete list)

- Inpatient hospitalization
- Emergency room
- Ambulance
- Outpatient hospital costs
- Physical therapy
- Chiropractic care
- Durable medical equipment
- Prosthetics and orthotics
- Oxygen
- Cosmetic surgery
- Home health and hospice services
- Vision screening, glasses and contact lenses
- Dental care
- Travel shots
- Birth control (available through other programs)
- Mammograms
- Mental health and substance abuse services
- Dialysis
- Injectable medications
- Medications not on the NHP list of covered medications.
